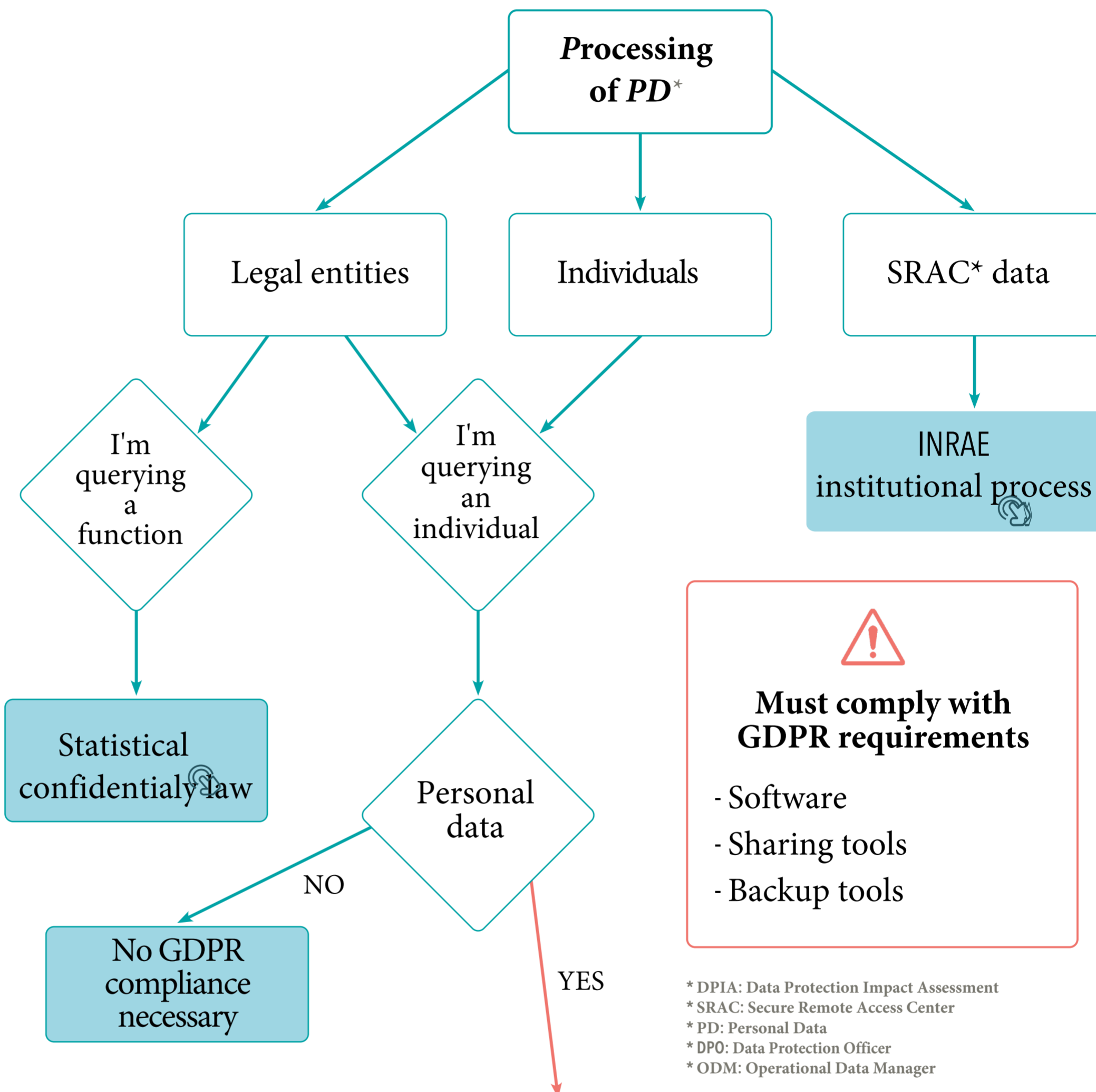




Process of applying the GDPR to research activities

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) has been applicable since May 25, 2018. Its aim is to harmonize legal rules at the European level and to strengthen the protection of citizens' rights and freedoms. In concrete terms, GDPR represents the necessary justification of the compliance of data processing with regulatory requirements. Irrespective of the discipline or research theme involved, all researchers are concerned whenever they process so-called personal data.

This process is based on the experience of MoISA (Montpellier Interdisciplinary research center on Sustainable Agri-food systems) joint research unit, the department's pilot unit for a simplified data registration procedure.
